**CLUB NEWS****MAY MEETING RE-CAP**

Buck Ridge Ski Club held its May meeting on Wednesday, May 3, 2006; there were about 28 people in attendance. Members present witnessed the installation of the new officers for the 2006/2007 year: Jack Schmader, President; Larry Hardin, Vice-President; Pat Beccia, Secretary, and Terri Walklett, Treasurer. Jennie Henchel, John's widow, presented a moving review of her late husband's relationship with the club. Dan Jones also spoke of his plans for canoe and rafting trips in the coming year. He's planning a trip on the Lehigh River sometime this summer.

We heard a review of the coming year's ski schedule, including the planned trip to Alyeska in Alaska in March, 2007. Those interested in the Alyeska trip need to contact Dan Aronson as soon as possible. The schedule includes at least six planned trips to our lodge in Vermont in addition to planned trips to Sugarloaf in Maine, Jay Peak in Vermont, and the aforementioned trip to Alaska. It's good to see a really active ski schedule; remember, we are a ski club. There is also the Eastern Pennsylvania Ski Council Winter Carnival, which is scheduled in January at Jay Peak, Vermont, and the Council Cup Race at Blue Mountain in February with all the practice we're going to be doing to prepare for that. Plans were announced for another annual corn roast and swim party at Linvilla Orchards in September (see an announcement elsewhere in this newsletter. Next came presentation of awards. Glenn Weisel was awarded the Jeff Wilhoyte award and Keith and Marvelene Richards were awarded life memberships in the club. A new award, the Carson-Gude Award, was also announced to recognize those who make extraordinary contributions to the improvement and general livability of our Vermont lodge. Following the awards presentation we were treated to a very interesting and well-organized presentation by Susan Hearn. Each year the club has the opportunity to recognize members who have made outstanding contributions over the years. This year, in addition to a life membership award and the WilhoYTE award, a new award, the Carson-Gude, was added.

### LIFE MEMBER AWARD

#### *Keith and Marvelene Richards*

Keith and Marvelene Richards were awarded Life Memberships in Buck Ridge Ski Club at the club's meeting on May 3, 2006. These awards were given in recognition of their efforts in leading club activities and in performing services for the club over a period of several years.

Keith Richards was the former editor of Slopes & Trails, and he also established the club website, which will grow in importance as a means of communicating with club membership in the coming months and years. Each month for several years, Keith faithfully edited input from the membership and other sources, often providing input of his own, to produce a quality newsletter which was enjoyed by all of our members. He kept the website updated, and he never missed a deadline. It is an honor and a privilege to include him as a Life Member of the Buck Ridge Ski Club.

Marvelene Richards has been the club's Biking Chair-person for the past several years. Each year she has developed an interesting schedule of biking trips, long and short, local and not so local, day trips, and overnight trips. The venues have always been attractive with interesting dining options along the way, and the good company of club members and their friends to enjoy. We are honored to present Marv with Life Membership in Buck Ridge Ski Club.

### WILHOYTE AWARD

#### *Glenn Weisel*

Glenn Weisel was awarded the Jeff WilhoYTE award at the May 3, 2006, meeting of the Buck Ridge Ski Club. The WilhoYTE award was designed and approved by the Board of Governors in August 1980 to honor Jeff WilhoYTE. This award is made to a member (s) of the club who has made an outstanding contribution to Buck Ridge Ski Club during the previous year or years.

Jeff, whose full name is Howard Jefferson WilhoYTE, joined the Buck Ridge Ski Club in 1946 and

was active until he retired from DuPont in 1976 and moved to Boulder, Colorado. He participated in all of the club activities; however, he made his major contributions to the club in canoeing and in the organization of the club itself and in the development of club meetings. Jeff started the newsletter, Slopes and Trails. He was President in 1951 and 1952. He felt strongly that club meetings with excellent speakers and presentations were essential for attracting good members to the growing organization. A talented photographer and speaker, he set a high standard for slide presentations. A qualified Dale Carnegie instructor, he gave their course in public speaking to Buck Ridge members to upgrade the quality of reports at meetings.

Glenn was given the WilhoYTE award in recognition of his efforts over the past several years in making improvements to our lodge and in leading several ski trips, most notably, the annual trip to Jay Peak in Vermont. Glenn has led our fall work parties for the past few years, often remaining at the lodge to finish up projects after the others have returned home. His dedication, tireless effort, and resourcefulness in locating building materials, cabinetry, appliances, and other items used in improving the lodge have earned him the Jeff WilhoYTE award.

### THE CARSON-GUDE AWARD

The Carson-Gude award was designed and approved by the Board of Governors in February, 2006, to honor Dick Carson and Helmut Gude. This award is made to a member or members of the club who have performed extraordinary service at our Woodbridge Lodge in Vermont over the previous year or years. Its purpose is to recognize contributions at the lodge that go above and beyond those ordinary services performed at our annual work parties and which result in benefits that are enjoyed by all members each time they visit the lodge. The first recipients of the award are Richard Carson and Helmut Gude.

**RICHARD CARSON**

Dick joined the Buck Ridge Ski Club in 1975 and remains an active member at the present time. During his time with BRSC Dick has participated in a wide variety of club activities. His selection for the Carson-Gude award is based on the work he completed at Woodbridge Lodge during the 1990's, assisting Helmut Gude with the renovation of the bunk rooms, constructing both kitchens at the lodge, and in personally building the beautiful tables that we enjoy in the living and dining areas of the lodge today. Dick purchased the solid cherry pieces from which the tabletops are made at a local mill in Vermont, took them home, and painstakingly finished and assembled them, then transported them back up to the lodge where they now grace the living quarters there. He also constructed the large dining table in use in our upper dining room. We are honored to have him as a club member and as the co-nominee for the initial Carson-Gude award.

**HELMUT GUDE**

Helmut Gude became a member of Buck Ridge Ski Club in the 1970's and remained a member until his untimely death in the 1990's. As a member of our club, Helmut was involved in a wide variety of activities; but his greatest contribution to our club was the total renovation of the bunk rooms at Woodbridge Lodge, which made everyone's stay at the lodge much more enjoyable. Before Helmut's improvements the upper bunks were studiously avoided due to the difficulty in reaching them. Helmut installed easy to use wide stairways from the floor to the upper bunk level for all upper bunks, making all of them easily accessible. Before his improvements one had difficulty finding a place to put personal belongings, clothing, towels, etc. Helmut installed a towel rack, a large shelf and a small shelf with each bunk, making it possible to hang one's towel to dry after taking a shower, and giving one a place for wallet, keys, glasses, pill bottles, clean clothes, and all manner of other things. He also reconstructed the bunks themselves, making them sturdier and more attractive, and installed a number of hanging rods throughout the rooms on which clothes could be hung. When the lodge is filled to capacity, all those little things make for a much more enjoyable stay than was possible before Helmut worked his magic. We are honored to have had him as a club member and as the co-nominee for the initial Carson-Gude award.

**Eligibility for the Award:**

1. Nominees need to have been members of Buck Ridge for at least ten (10) years.
2. Nominees need not be officers or committee members.
3. The service performed must have resulted in a significant improvement or addition to the facilities at Woodbridge Lodge such that it greatly enhances the comfort and/or appeal of the lodge for visitors.
4. The award could be given to a husband and wife jointly or shared by two members for joint effort in the same area or on the same project.

**Selection Procedure:**

1. The award is given at the May meeting. The Award need not necessarily be given each year if there seems no one appropriate to the standards that year.
2. The President shall appoint four members as the Awards Committee in the Fall for the forthcoming year. The Vice-President shall be chairperson of this committee. Previous award winners, if any, should be on the committee.
3. The Awards Committee shall begin no later than March to solicit nominations from the general membership. Nominations should include background information as to why the nominee should receive an award.
4. The Awards Committee will consider all nominations, and may add their own.
5. The Committee makes its recommendation to the Board. If the Board gives approval, the award shall be given as recommended. The Board can decline the recommendation and name another recipient or choose not to offer the award.
6. Approval of the general membership is not required nor is it requested. Approval of this award is not to be a subject for general membership discussion.

**The Award:**

Like the Jeff Wilhoyte Trophy, the Carson-Gude trophy remains a club possession. Each recipient's name is placed on the trophy. A small permanent trophy is given each year to the recipient to keep. In addition, recipients of the Carson-Gude award are given a lifetime pass for Woodbridge Lodge which

entitles them to free lodging providing that space is available. Recipients will also receive a copy of the lodge key for their personal use.

## TRIBUTE TO JOHN HENCHEL

The passing of John Henchel, a long time Buck Ridger, was briefly noted in the May newsletter. His wife provided a moving remembrance of him at the May meeting, and many members recall skiing and hiking with him over the years. Three generations of the Henschels have skied with the club now! Those making memorial donations are asked to make them to Swarthmore College Alumni Scholarship Fund, 500 College Avenue, Swarthmore, PA, 19081. Jim Calkins has provided the following memorial:

John Henchel, a long time Buck Ridger, died of prostate cancer on March 24. He was an avid downhill skier and skied at the BRSC Lodge from the 1960s, when it was quite primitive, until the season before he died. He was a former treasurer of the Club and helped with auditing for later treasurers. John served as a Navy officer in World War 2 and graduated from Swarthmore College in 1948. He worked for Provident Mutual Life Insurance Company for 35 years where he played a major role in introducing computers into the business. After retiring, he taught mathematics for 13 years at Community College of Philadelphia. He is survived by his wife Jane, son Larry of Salt Lake City, and daughter Valerie and granddaughter Danielle of Virginia Beach, VA.
