**Lodge Use:** Members are reminded about the changes in lodge use policy implemented last season regarding cancellations and guest use.

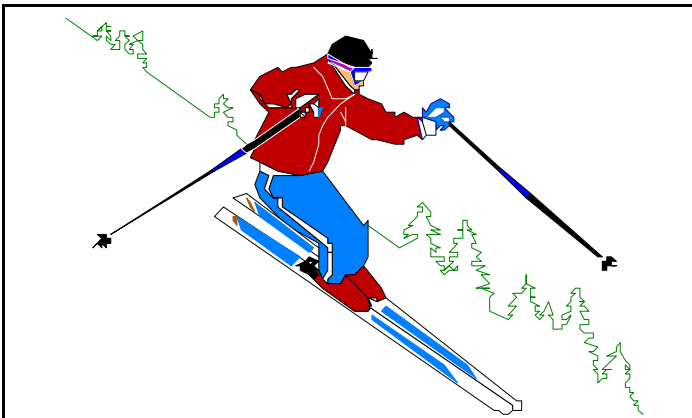

### BIKING

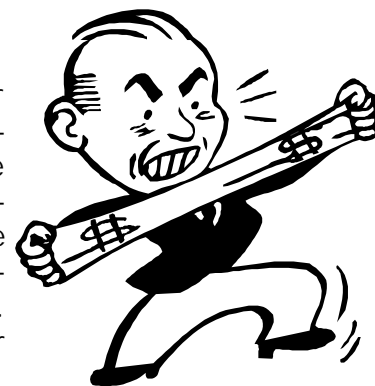
Scheduled bike trips are over for the season. Dave Singer led the last trip on October 4, and provides his account below...

Biking Chair Susan Hearn met us at the Shoprite, and we rode through the back roads of Gloucester and Salem Counties in New Jersey. As it was a "drop-dead gorgeous" Indian Summer day, there were a few more cars on the road than expected, but we managed to avoid all of them. We stopped as planned at Richman's Ice Cream just outside of Woodstown, where we enjoyed the treats from the 1947 Art Deco former headquarters. The rest of us rode back on almost deserted roads with some rolling hills and made it back to the Shoprite after completing 27 miles at a comfortable pace. ## \$kiing on the Cheap



With the current state of the economy causing many folks to look harder at how to *s - t - r - e - t - c - h* their vacation dollar, finding economical skiing options can be a challenge. Buck Ridgers' are fortunate to have the Woodbridge Lodge, which makes your stay in ski country much more affordable. The price of lift tickets, however, has been soaring. The loss of the group rate benefit at Mount Snow that was formerly available to club members has made finding reasonably priced lift tickets even more of a challenge. So what's a skier to do? If purchasing a season pass does not fit in with your skiing style, here's some options to help hold the line on lift tickets costs.

**Eastern PA Ski Council:** A benefit of club membership is participation in the EPSC, which has an advance purchase program offering discounted lift tickets to many ski areas throughout the northeast. These tickets are an excellent value, but must be purchased in advance for use during the season. The return policy for unused tickets varies by ski area, and this year the EPSC will impose a \$1 fee on all returned tickets to help offset the cost of the program. As of this writing, the EPSC ticket prices have not yet been announced, but will be posted as soon as available.

Another option for skiers to consider are the "frequent skier" cards that many areas now offer. These cards typically provide direct to lift convenience and reduced ticket rates. And remember—every dollar saved is another dollar for beer or gear! Some of those that are convenient to Woodbridge Lodge include:

**Stratton:** The **X2 Card**, at \$65 for early season purchase, comes with a free ticket pre-loaded and offers \$30 off midweek / \$20 off weekend non-holiday lift tickets. It's a great buy if you can pick it up before mid-October, when it jumps to \$85.

**Mount Snow:** While they have discontinued the group purchase plan formerly enjoyed by club members, they do offer the **FanFare Card** for \$99. This provides 50% off weekday / 25% off weekend non-holiday lift tickets.

**Magic Mountain:** Magic has the "**Magic Card**" for \$39, with which you can purchase \$25 midweek tickets and get \$10 off on weekends, plus discount days and special offers throughout the season. How often can you get a \$25 lift tickets these days?

**Stowe:** While Stowe is a little far for most Buck Ridgers, and their lift rates are reaching new heights (despite the fact the we as taxpayers now own a piece of them!), they do offer some great deals on their **Ski Council / Club Appreciation Days**. This season the days are December 5-7, 2008; January 12-14, 2009; and March 18-22, 2009. Single day adult tickets are \$40, and senior (65+) tickets are \$22, with multi-day tickets lower still. You will need your council/club membership card and photo id. For more information visit [www.stowegroups.com](http://www.stowegroups.com) and look for it under "announcements".

**Killington:** The "**Club Card**" is a credit card style card that comes loaded with four (4) single day adult lift tickets for \$200. It is only available to ski club/council members and must be purchased by December 17. For all the details or to buy one, you need to visit [www.killington.com/winter/plan/clubcard/index.html](http://www.killington.com/winter/plan/clubcard/index.html) or call 800-887-3257. The card can be re-loaded during the season at \$50 per ticket provided the initial purchase was made before December 17. You must present your photo ID and your valid ski club/ski council membership card when using the Club Card.

What about the skier who does not want to commit to a particular mountain, yet go on the spur of the moment and still be able to hold down on lift costs? For those folks, **Classic Ski Tours of Vermont** has a product—the **Vermont Travel Club Card**— that allows participants to receive savings and discounts for lift tickets, lodging,



and restaurants at popular resorts throughout Vermont. Full details on participating merchants and benefits are available by visiting the web site - [www.classicskitours.net](http://www.classicskitours.net) - and clicking on Vermont Travel Club Card. Of interest to Buck Ridgers, the card offers \$26 off one day lift tickets at Mount Snow any time excluding holidays, and up to \$28 off at Stratton on selected days during the season. It also gets you the same reduced rate lift tickets at Magic Mountain as the Magic Card!

The Vermont Travel Club card sells for \$35, but Buck Ridge members can purchase them for \$25 using the promotion code "**brsc09**". Use of the card requires a photo id, and they are non-transferable. For the skier wanting the greatest flexibility, the **Vermont Travel Club Card** looks like a great deal.
