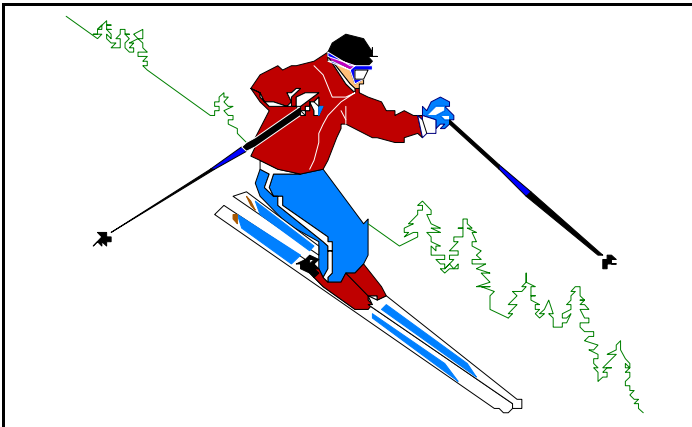

Roof Repair at Woodbridge Lodge

A major event took place at the lodge from Sunday 8/10/2008 through Sunday 8/17/2008. An undertaking of this magnitude has not been attempted at the lodge in the last 30 years or so - not since projects like the lower kitchen addition, the rear bedroom addition, upper dining room and the fireplace. Work party participants were primarily 3 families and one friend of the families: Jerry and Theresa Crowe; Kevin and Cheryl Amey with their children, Ryan and Sarah; Tim Stoecker; Ken Sr. and Marisa Bean with their son, Zach.

The lodge committee has been struggling with the idea of replacing the roof on the lodge for the past several years, but could not get a consensus to "do it ourselves" because of the difficulty and danger of working on a steep roof and the sheer magnitude of the work. When the committee pretty much ruled out the do-it-yourself option, we started to look at other options and actually had two contractors, who also happened to be members, submit proposals. With approval from the Lodge Committee and the Club's Board of Directors to support the cost of this important project, it was decided to give the job to our members Crowe, Amey and Bean for completion this summer.



The Gang of Ten

Last week I had the pleasure to not only work with this great group of people but get to know them as fellow Buck Ridgers and friends. When it came time to work, they all pitched in with everyone contributing, no matter their age everyone helped to complete a task. As usual on work parties, once the job is underway it is really a lot of fun working together, but I have to say they did put a hurtin' on me when it came time to move the bundles of shingles on to the roof from the crane. I was amazed at the ease in which Ken, Tim and Zach carted off each bundle (weighing about 75 lbs each) to be stacked along the ridges, while Jerry, Kevin and I unloaded and shuttled shingles to the others.

The job progressed smoothly every day once the rain delays were over, which probably caused about two days of delay all together. During those delays, trees were trimmed, repairs were made inside and general clean-up of weeds and brush around the outside of the building was accomplished. Another unanticipated delay was caused by the roof structural damage from rot and carpenter ants. It was necessary to replace the whole lower kitchen roof sheathing since the plywood had delaminated. The chimney gable sheathing and a few rafters had to be replaced, as well as the edges a couple feet up on the rear addition. An infestation of carpenter ants had invaded the valley and edge of the roof and rafters on the roof edge behind the ski room (in the valley where we had the most leaks in the past).



Making Progress

Jerry led the way with his technical expertise and gentle guidance while Kevin made sure that safety was always in the forefront as the job progressed through the different phases. Ken was a mainstay on the roof, working with Tim and Zach, running the courses and the valleys. Sarah and Ryan were always looking for ways to help out and assisted with many of the support tasks such as clean-up and other helper jobs. Working to keep everyone well supported were Theresa, Cheryl and Marisa running errands, preparing and serving meals, providing drinks and cleaning up after all of the activity that was going on all week.

Some pictures are attached to show some of the phases of the job. Unfortunately there was not time to get a picture of the finished roof, but that will give us all something to look forward to when we visit the lodge. Try to get up to the lodge to see this important new addition to the lodge and if you happen to meet this great group of Buck Ridgers and can thank them personally for their hard work, I am sure they will be pleased.

- Replace front door (or at least paint the old door)
- Install new doors on the third bathroom, and two shower rooms
- Remove old cabinet, sink, and countertop in third bathroom and replace
- Install tile floor in third bathroom to match other bathrooms and shower rooms
- Troubleshoot well pump issue and decide plan of maintenance or replacement
- Septic Tank Cleanout by local vendor / dig down to tank lid in preparation
- Receive and stack 2 cords of firewood in our now EMPTY woodshed
- Readjust new light on back of woodshed
- Change light bulbs as needed
- Replace ALL smoke alarm batteries and CO alarm batteries
- Wash all windows
- Install all storm window panels and store screens in the attic for winter.
- Fill liquid soaps, stock paper products
- Pull out trash compactor, ranges, and refrigerators, clean appliances and reset
- Replace outdoor receptacles with ground faults
- Lubricate sliding woodshed doors
- Build new set of steps full width of woodshed
- System check on low temp alarm by Mike Redin , Wilmington
- General yard clean up and weed-whacking
- Urethane ladders to upper bunks
- Patch drywall in upper bunk area of second bedroom on first floor
- Remove all mattress covers, take to Laundromat, wash, dry, return and reinstall
- General cleaning of lodge interior
